

Outdoor Display using multiple different vessels



## Wayne Regional Agricultural Fair NC

Built 2 trellis units measuring 8'x5'x4' cost of materials \$145 plus cost to build and stain each \$300- each unit \$445





## Virginia State Fair

Built a quilt hanging system suspended from ceiling

\$30 for each suspension unit - all metal- 10' metal dowel and 2 x 10' pieces of chain



## Tennesee Valley Fair

Built a pergola to house their Fairy Garden Displays- 16'x16'- It was made to be easily assembled and for storage after the Fair- it has a versatile use for many areas



#### North Dakota State Fair

Born Again Junk was the theme- they brought in things from home and used the entries to decorate like a campsite

No cost - all borrowed

## **Erie County Fair**

\$30 for 2x4's and 2 guys 1 hr to construct- pallets free

500 berry baskets - \$223.57

- + 24 Bushel baskets \$126.96
- + One bag of cocoa shell mulch, \$4.29 for 2 cubic feet
- + Boards, bricks, burlap, moss, bark, and rectangular wooden baskets left over from previous displays (\$355)

Now that's a cookie and square display!




## Clay County Fair Iowa

Created a 'Flower Shop'


\$628.75 (cart \$270 )

property and now move it around to display different exhibits at this Washington Fair




## Ozark Empire Fair, Missouri

- Some facts about the Dunnville Agricultural Fair
  - Does not own land
  - The complete Fair is housed in ¾ of an acre on county land
  - Has a 15x15' storage room to store our display items etc
  - In 6 days sets up, holds the Fair and tears it down
  - We have one small building to display our exhibits the rest of the Fair is done with tents and a 53' mobile entertainment stage that we receive from Haldimand County

I understand coming from a small Fair that we all have limited space and time for displaying items as we may be judging, displaying and have opening ceremonies on the same day.

I hope that you are able to take back some ideas that can be used at your Fair

I will send you with something I was told by some of the larger Fairs in the USA who have millions thru their gate

"Just remember that we all deal with the same struggles and concerns - just in a different scale"
